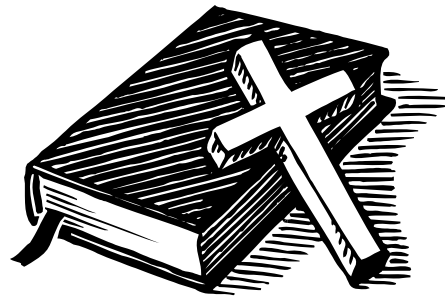

Dear Beloved Friends Of GIMI,

Blessed early Spring greetings to you in the name of Jesus Christ! By the time you receive this newsletter, JoAnne and I will still be in Africa sharing the Word of God and the message of Christ's love with literally thousands of people. We will have started out in Kenya, worked our way up to the border and crossed over into Uganda, and then we will have driven many miles down to the capitol of Kampala where we will spend just a few days of rest after our first mission team returns to America. Then, in just a few days, we will be joined by our GIMI Board Chairman, Doug Ezzell, and travel on to Western Uganda, and then cross over the mountains into Rwanda. All along the way on this long safari for Jesus, we will have preached the Gospel of Jesus Christ in numbers of prisons and schools. And, we will have ministered to hundreds of our "Prison Kids" in the prisons by providing basic necessities for them and their moms while they are in prison together. I do pray that all of you are remembering to pray for us as we keep pushing on by the grace of God. It would truly be impossible for us to keep going week after week, and month after month, if it were not for the prayers of God's people.

I also want to express how grateful we are for being called by God to be His ambassadors! What a privilege to represent the King of kings and Lord of lords all over the world. Truthfully, this would not have been the way I would have planned our married lives together, but JoAnne and I know very well that the choice was not ours, but His! We are very thrilled to represent our wonderful Savior wherever we go, but especially on the continent of Africa. We have never worked or ministered anywhere in the world where people are so receptive to the Gospel and where the Word of God is any more respected! If we had planned our lives, we would probably be back at home in a comfortable pastorate trying to lead God's people on to greater heights and deeper depths in His Kingdom. And, I can assure you that we would spend more nights at home sleeping in our bed. Yet, when we surrendered our lives completely to Jesus many years ago, we said that we would do whatever He asked, and go wherever He would send us just as long



as we can. So, here we are in Africa working with our national staff reaching people with the Good News of Jesus Christ. I can tell you very honestly that we often are very tired, but we never get bored! And, there is much to be said

for this when so much of the world lives without purpose and is bored stiff because they don't have a ministry to fill their empty hearts and lives. So, we are very happy in what we are doing, and all of you, our friends, make it possible for us to keep going, along with all of the African nationals that work with us. I would just remind all of us that the ministry of GIMI is truly a team effort! And, when every team member does his or her part, the team will win! Therefore, we know that we are on the winning team because the victory was won at Calvary and at the resurrection. Our main concern should be to represent our King as a good ambassador by being a faithful team member. I truly feel sorry for those who want to be lone rangers and do their own thing when God has planned for us to be a part of His great team, the body of believers! I pray that I will never get over the wonder of being a team ambassador for Jesus Christ! And, one day when He comes again, we really pray that He will be pleased with our team efforts! I sincerely pray that God will not only bless your ministries, but I pray that He will increase your finances because you have chosen to be a part of GIMI! I really believe that He will. He has promised to bless those who invest in eternity, and the only way to invest in eternity is to invest in souls which are the only things that are going to heaven. Let me just ask all of you dear pastors to really consider being a regular part of GIMI if you are not already supporting this fruitful and productive ministry. If you will, you will be a vital part of every soul that comes to Christ!

While I am thanking our supporting “Churches of Distinction” (You can find a list of these on our website), let me also thank those churches where JoAnne and I have had the privilege to visit in special meetings like revivals, Bible Conferences, seminars, etc. During January and the first few days of February, we were privileged to be in South Texas conducting meetings for the Cornerstone Baptist Church, Alice, Texas, where J.J. Rodriguez is the dear pastor. Then, the following week, we were with the kind and dear people of Agua Dulce (Sweet Water) Baptist Church, Agua Dulce, Texas, where the pastor is Joey Galloway. On the final week of this three week safari for Jesus, we were with our dear pastor friend, Odell Daughtry, at the North Bay Fellowship Church in Ingleside, Texas. Folks, Jesus rent the heavens in these meetings and gave us 76 people who prayed to receive Jesus Christ as personal Savior. In addition, numbers of believers made new commitments of their lives to Jesus with a fuller surrender than they had ever done in their life time. We are still praising God for these marvelous meetings, and we thank the three pastors and their kind hospitable people for allowing us to minister in their midst. And, we are still praising Jesus for all that He did. These were three of the greatest revival meetings that I have ever preached, and believe me, I have preached many of them. In fact, I have preached over 1,000 revival meetings and other special meetings during my 45 years of ministry. And, in this day when churches are cold, the Spirit of God is no where to be found in so many of them, and when people within the churches have lost their passion for winning people to Christ, but seemingly, not their passion to fight with each other, it was so refreshing to being in three churches where God moved in a mighty way. I already look forward to being back with all three of these churches next year, Lord willing! Who knows, JoAnne and I may just become Winter Texans next year!

Before I close this note of thanks, I also want to thank all of the churches where JoAnne and I will be privileged to be after we return from this trip to Africa. We truly have a full schedule in the churches ahead of us, and we are so grateful for the confidence that these dear pastors have in us that they would welcome

us to minister to their churches. I would ask all of you to really pray for these upcoming meetings, and if you want to see where we will be over the next few months, and even up into the Fall, please visit our website or review our newsletter carefully so that you can attend the meetings if we are in your area. We would really love to see as many of your as we possibly can if we come your way. Also, please don't forget to pray for all of our trips back to Africa this year. We have at least two more long and hard trips back to Africa, and we will have several teams from America coming out to work with us. We still could use some people to fill some of our teams if you feel Jesus is leading you to be on the front lines of winning people to Christ. If so, please contact Tina Houston, at our office and headquarters in North Carolina, and she will send you the information on the spots that are still available for Africa this year. If God wants you to go, we would really love to have you, and we really could use your help! Pray about this and let us know!

“PRISON KIDS CARE BOXES”

Most of you know that for the past few years, we have been collecting “Operation Child Care Gift Boxes” for the many orphan school children in the schools where we have adopted. We have shipped hundreds of boxes to Africa to help these dear children with their school supplies, toiletries, and other basic items which they need so desperately. God has really blessed this extended ministry to these hurting school children.

If you read our last newsletter very carefully, you know that GIMI had to close our Children of Promise children's home in Uganda due to the fact that our director and assistant director believed it was God's will for them to leave COP, and because we had been operating in the red for three years. Therefore, instead of spending \$60,000 per year on just a few children, we have decided to expand our Prison Kids ministry to include getting individuals and churches to fill some new boxes for these prison kids. We have begun this ministry, and some of you have already started helping us with this project. I would like to ask many more of you to really consider getting involved in this special project. If you are interested in doing so, just contact our office, and we will furnish the boxes and the instruction sheets so that you can get started. We do ask that you fill the boxes with items listed on the instruction sheet, and then place \$10.00 in each box to help us pay the shipping for the boxes when we ship the containers to Africa. This \$10 will go a long way in helping us pay for the shipping which has absolutely gone out of sight over the past couple of years. Right now, it presently costs over \$7,000 to ship a 20 ft. container to Uganda. So, I think you can see that we need your help!

I would also like to say that the “Prison Kids Care Boxes” is not a Christmas project, but a year round project. As I stated, you can do them as individuals, with your family, as youth groups, Sunday School classes, or with your pastor's permission, include your entire church family. Folks, I am telling you that there are literally hundreds of kids in prison in Africa and they genuinely need our help. They didn't deserve to be in prison, but they are there to no fault of their own, and we need to help them. JoAnne and I have helped many of them on this present trip, but there is far more to be done. Will you please help us with these “Prison Kids Care Boxes” right away? I trust that you will!

“Update On Operation Coverup”

By now, most of you know that just before this last Christmas we kicked off a project to try to raise funds for a special blanket project to provide a good quality blanket for as many of our 170,000 prisoners as possible. Our goal is to eventually purchase 100,000 blankets to meet the need of so many of our prisoners that are suffering unbearably in the damp and cold prisons of our African countries. I know that some of you probably think of Africa as always being hot and humid. This is true in some areas, but in many areas where we minister, our prisons are in the mountains at higher altitudes where there is much dampness and often time at night, it gets very cold. Most of these prisoners sleep on the ground, on concrete floors, and maybe a small number on thin stinking mats that were provided a long time ago. And, because of these horrible conditions, the prisoners get sick with all kinds of diseases, and many often die. To us Americans, it is very easy for us to take for granted the blankets and sheets that we have to sleep under, but try to imagine yourself sleeping with inadequate clothing, no sheets or blankets, and then trying to stay warm in these conditions. I have seen these conditions scores of times through the years, and I can tell you that it is a terrible place to be. So, if you have not helped us with this project up to this point, or even if you have already given to this project, and God nudges you to give again, we surely could use your help.

I have included another photo of our blanket distribution in a women’s prison in Uganda during our last trip there. And, while JoAnne and I are on this trip, we are distributing more blankets to these very needy people. The fact is that we are still very far from our goal, but by God’s grace, we will just keep pushing on trying to raise these funds for however long it takes, because the need is so great and no one else is attempting to meet this need. The governments in the countries where we work provides some cheap blankets, but they don’t last long, and in a matter of a few months, these blankets come to pieces and the inmates are without covering again. Therefore, we are trying to hard to provide good quality blankets that will last at least a few years in these horrible conditions. So, will you help us with this project today? We must help these people because it is hard to tell a cold suffering prisoner about the loving warmth of our Savior’s love! Do you understand what I am saying? These blankets are just another means of sharing the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ! I pray that you will help us right away! Meet Augustine . . .



A Miraculously Transformed Man!

Through the many years of this ministry, we have been asked scores of times if there are real testimonies to how God has dramatically changed the lives of our prisoners and students. I am sure that this question comes quite often because of the large number of people we have praying each year to receive Jesus Christ as personal Savior. There are some people that are genuinely interested, while others ask this question out of their skepticism. Well, the truth is that we have hundreds and hundreds of testimonies, both given verbally and in writing by those who have been transformed by the power of Jesus Christ through the ministry of GIMI. Today, I want to introduce you to one more of them! His name is Augustine Kisega, and he is presently 34 years old.

Back last November just before JoAnne and I returned home to America from our last trip to Africa, Augustine joined us for dinner at our Uganda guesthouse. Augustine had just been released from prison a few months before. Augustine’s testimony was that just over thirteen years ago he was arrested, accused, and convicted of murder, a crime which he did not commit. He was convicted however, and he has spent the last thirteen years in prison, much of which was spent in the condemned section of Uganda’s main prison. Before going to prison, Augustine was living with his mother as a teenager and his father had died many years before. He had not even finished elementary school and probably was headed for a life of meager existence at the most. But through a miscarriage of justice as is so often the case in Africa, Augustine was convicted of a crime he did not commit and was sent to death row in a Uganda prison.

While waiting for trial in another Uganda prison, my predecessor, Mr. Mickey Parrish, went to that prison and started preaching Jesus to Augustine and the other prisoners. Augustine did not originally get saved, but after being convicted and transferred to death row, God really began to deal with his heart because of the preaching of Brother Mickey, and then in 2004, my wife and I went to the Condemned prison to share the message of salvation with Augustine and the other prisoners. On that day in 2004, Augustine prayed to receive Christ as his personal Savior. His life was dramatically changed by the power of God, and he then began to study the Bible every day, and he grew dynamically in the Lord. Also, following his conversion, he started taking primary and secondary schools classes that were being offered in the prison, and he eventually received high school diploma.

This past July of 2009, Augustine went before the appeals court in Uganda, and after 13 years in prison, they set him free and declared him not guilty. Thus, when Augustine was in our house eating dinner with us, he was overwhelmed with God's blessings and all that had occurred in his life. I asked Augustine, "Are you bitter over what happened to you?" He emphatically said to me, "Oh, Dr. Stan, how could I be bitter? If I had not gone to prison, I probably would not have gotten saved, I could not have grown in the Lord Jesus, and I probably would never have finished my schooling." "So, I am not bitter, and I hold no grudges toward those who mistakably sent me to prison, or even my family members that forsook me when I became a prisoner." Friends, this kind of testimony is truly evidence of a Divine transformation! And, JoAnne and I have been privileged to see scores of these through the years.

Now, I would ask you to please pray for Augustine as he is getting ready to start in the university, and he is now traveling back to some prisons with a preacher friend preaching the Gospel to other prisoners. Praise God for His transforming power! And beloved friends, because of your prayers and financial support, you have been a vital part of Augustine's story! Do you think this ministry is worth it? I would shout, "Yes it is!"

LETTER FROM THE FIELD

Dear Sir,

Thank God that I've found you. I am a 29 year old man. I was once and had been a prisoner over an alleged aggravated defilement case for over a period of 6 years remanded at Murchison Bay Prison in Luzira. I was just recently released on 23rd of July 2009 since February 2nd of 2004, after having been found not guilty.

I do and really did appreciate your tender loving, saving, healing and delivering services you offered to us and still offering, during my time of confinement. It's because of your often coming visits to us that strengthened me, gave me hope and power to push on. I will never forget our great sister Janet Morrison who used to cheer us with joyous praises and worship songs. My great granny JoAnne with her Bible, Our heart of love pastor Dr. Andrea Sinclair whom at once served with as an interpreter at the distribution table of drugs.

Thank you for saving my soul from hell in the name of our lord Jesus Christ. It was because of you that I committed my life to Jesus. You gave me a new beginning and anew inspiration. I loved and gave myself to serving God, singing and making songs during my last days (of which I didn't know) in prison. Janet inspired me to make Gospel songs, and God helped and I did quite a number of them, even some that our group used to sing in the Prison's Church. Many in our mother language which with time I want to add more art and instruments, do the recording so that people can hear them and get touched. I was built up with a vision, if God helps me with funds, to continue and study Church Ministry and the art of Gospel songs in a Bible College.

I want to take you to the song that I did and created for that unique inner man in you while in prison. I called it "Gateway".
