## Pea-Sized Christianity

Dear Beloved Friends of GIMI,

Recently, JoAnne and I were privileged to take a few days off for some very much needed rest and recuperation. We were blessed to be able to stay in one of our dear friend's home near the ocean on the outer banks of South Carolina. In preparation for this trip, I was going through some of my older books which I wanted to take to read during our down days. I ran across a book that was written back in the 1980's entitled, "In The Gap", which was written by David Bryant who was serving with Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship at that time. I love books on missions, and this is truly one of the greatest books I have ever read on missions. I recommend it to every born again believer; especially to every church leader.

In this book, "In The Gap", on pages 47-48, the author talks about how Pea-Sized Christianity has kept the average American Christian and church from getting out of the box and taking the Gospel to the world. What Mr. Bryant says on these two pages is absolutely phenomenal. Therefore, I want to quote much of this entire section in this month's newsletter. I pray that you will pay much attention to this article and let God challenge you to get out of the box and comfort zone and begin to help all of us take the Gospel to a lost world.

### "Boxes of Pea-Sized Christianity"

"When Peter opposed Christ's expressed mission to the cross (see Matt. 16:21-23) he was told: "Get out of my way, Satan. You are a hindrance to me. You're approaching this mission from a human perspective, not God's." Peter was still in his own box of pea-sized Christianity."

"Pea-sized Christianity comes in boxes of many shapes and sizes, and at least one box can fit any Christian who allows it. These boxes keep us from a discipleship and an evangelism that's big enough to fill a world-sized Gap. You don't find very many sunrises in a box!"

"For example, there is a pea-sized box called **convert Christianity**--life in Christ gets no bigger than making it safely inside the Kingdom. Or there's **character Christianity**--life in Christ gets no bigger than pulling one's own spiritual act together. Not far behind this follows **consumption Christianity**--which boxes up life in Christ into meet one's own personal needs, and that's all."

"When life in Christ is no bigger than the warm, secure fellowship I have each week with my good Christian buddies, I am in the box of **cloister Christianity**. Or, when life in Christ is no bigger than getting nicely settled in a good paying job after graduation, then I'm trapped in **career Christianity**. Many of us are groping around the box of **church Christianity**--our life in Christ has grown no bigger than the Sunday School picnic, the choir's Christmas pageant, the monthly finance committee meetings, or scouting out who's absent from mid-week prayer service."

"A form of pea-sized Christianity that affects all of us to some degree is **culture Christianity**. In this box our life in Christ grows no bigger than a North American, white, middle-class brand of worship and witness. We relish in our tried-and-true traditions, which we erroneously equate with the eternal ways of the Kingdom itself."

"In summary, when my Christian experience expands no further than my salvation or small group, or church, or future, it's pea-sized. When I compartmentalize my walk with Christ into neat packages of prayer, Bible study, worship, fellowship, evangelism and (somewhere off to the side) missions, it's pea-sized. When my activities and interests don't vitally link me to the reaching of earth's unreached people, I've succumbed to pea-sized Christianity."

Now folks, I would like to ask you, "Do you have a pea-sized Christianity?" Or, have you accepted the cause of taking the Gospel to the entire world? Do you have a world-sized vision, or have you stayed in the box of your comfort zone and safe tradition? My friends, God has given to each of us the Great Commission, and whether He calls us to personally go to the mission fields or stay at home and pray and provide for others to go, we must adopt this as our life cause! In other words, God has called all of us to stand in the Gap of bringing people together with God through Christ the only Mediator! What a great privilege we have to be an ambassador for the King of Kings! Are you taking your privilege seriously? I pray you are!

## Wonderful Trip To Texas

During the last two weeks of January and the first two weeks of February, JoAnne and I traveled to the State of Texas where I preached four revival meetings in some wonderful churches. During our first week, we were with the Cornerstone Baptist Church, in Alice, Texas, where Pastor J.J. Rodriguez is the Interim Pastor. During the second week, we were privileged to be back at the Auga Dulce Baptist Church, in Auga Dulce, Texas. The church is without a pastor at this time, but the deacons and leaders of the church were so kind to us; especially Brother Dale Dupree and his dear wife, Gina. The third week of revival meetings was with one of our greatest GIMI supporting churches. This church is the North Bay Fellowship Church in Ingleside, Texas where Pastor Odell Daughtry is the dear leader. We are never treated any better on earth than we are at North Bay Fellowship, and the people of this dear church support GIMI on a regular basis. And, it is this dear church which continues to make all of our baby quilts for our Prison Kids in Africa. These quilt makers are under the direction of sister Lou Clark. It was truly a special blessing for JoAnne and myself to be with Pastor Odell, his dear wife, Linda, and the gracious people of North Bay Fellowship. Finally, during our fourth week in Texas, we were once again blessed to be with the gracious folks of Rural Shade Baptist Church in Cleveland, Texas where Brother Byron Reeves is the dear pastor. This was our third time with this great group of people, and we were treated with such kindness, and God really blessed this revival meeting. God really moved in all four of these revival meetings with over 100 dear people praying to receive Jesus Christ in the four churches. Praise God for His saving power, and praise God for the faithfulness of these church leaders who prepared for the revival meetings. I am sure that everyone that prayed to receive Christ probably didn't get saved during these meetings, but I know that many of them did. Praise God also for transformed lives!

Also, Pastor Jeff will be making the preparation for an upcoming mission team which is going with GIMI to Ghana in early August of this year. In addition, Pastor Jeff is scheduled to travel over to Togo with Pastor Baidoo, and there, they will do evangelism in the prisons and schools of Togo working with our Togo Director, Kofi Tchakram, who will be leading in their mission work there. Also, I need to mention that Pastor Jeff may also travel on over to Cotonou, Benin to meet with prison officials there, as we continue to work on starting a prison ministry in that small country. We have a new preacher there, Pastor Mathias Doukpo, who is helping us lay the ground work to begin a ministry in Benin. Please pray for pastor Jeff's trip! Pray that God will grant him traveling mercy to and from West Africa, and also while he is traveling in the countries where he will be ministering. Most of all, pray that God will give him a great harvest of souls. Brother Jeff will provide a good report of this trip when he returns! I would also ask all of you to pray for his wife, Jodi, and their three children while Jeff is away!

## Many New Doors Opening!

Dear friends, God has truly blessed Gateway International Missions, Inc. down through all of our years of trying faithfully to serve Jesus. Over the past ten years, GIMI has shared the Gospel with over four million people with over one million of these praying to receive Christ as personal Savior. During this past year alone, 2010, God has given us a harvest of over 125,000 people coming to Christ. We praise Him for all that He has done in the past, but we are truly excited about the new doors that are opening. With the economic down turn in America which has hurt our financial contributions, we have been very careful and wise about the way we have spent God's funds. And, right now, we are praying for Divine wisdom for walking through the new doors that are opening for us. God has been good to open formerly closed doors, but we know that we must be good stewards of what He provides through His people. Yet, the urgent call for us to take the Gospel to people that are begging for it demands that we walk through as many of these doors as possible because if we don't, the doors may not remain open.

Just recently, God has granted us authorization to work in the prisons of Liberia. Liberia is a country that suffered 14 years of civil war, and several months ago, we started a new ministry there with Pastor Arthur Yanweh being our new Liberian Director. Brother Arthur has been preaching in a lot of schools, and he has planted the new Good News Baptist Church. Then, just about a week ago, we received the notice that we now can enter the prisons there. Please pray for this **new ministry in Liberia**. And, I would ask one of you pastors and churches to partner with the Good News Baptist Church plant in order to help encourage this new church family. Please pray for our workers who are working through these new open doors.

Also, I wanted to share with you that it looks like we are going to be in the new country of **Benin, West Africa** as one of our new fields. As I mentioned earlier, Pastor Jeff Kautz, has been communicating with our new pastor friend, Mathias Doukpo, who has been doing all of the foundation work to start a new field of service there. Please pray for Pastor Mathias and this new field of work which God is opening for us.

Believe it or not, we recently have had communication with dear people in **Sudan** who are anxious to have our ministry there. Some of you probably know that recently, **Southern Sudan** conducted elections to succeed from **Northern Sudan**. If things go well, this new country of **Southern Sudan**, will be officially a new country in July. If this happens, this will be the newest country in the world, and it will be the 54th country in Africa. Right now we are communicating with some dear pastors in **Southern Sudan**, to see if God is opening the doors in the prisons there. Over the past several years, I have trained many of these Sudan pastors in seminars at our training center in Kampala, Uganda. Now, it would seem that God is going to use this past work to open new doors for us right now in a brand new country which has suffered so much because of war with the Northern Muslim government. Please pray that God's will should be done in this new area which seems to be opening for us.

While I am talking about **Sudan**, let me mention that recently I received a desperate plea from a medical doctor in **Darfur, Sudan, to please help the prisoners who are in prison in Darfur**. Most of these prisoners have been arrested by the Muslim Government and hidden away in prisons where nobody cares a thing about them. They are dying from many African diseases. **WILL YOU PLEASE HELP US RAISE \$3,000 FOR THESE DARFUR PRISONERS?** We need to raise these funds just as soon as we possibly can, so that we can purchase the medicine and medical equipment in Uganda and fly it up to Darfur. We have learned that the UN is making two flights per week from Entebbe, Uganda up to Darfur, and we can put the medicine and equipment on one of these flights! **PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE, CONSIDER HELPING US RIGHT AWAY! THIS IS TRULY AN EMERGENCY SITUATION, AND WE NEED YOUR HELP!** You can make a donation through our web site at:

When we get to Kenya, we will be joined by our GIMI Chairman, Doug Ezzell, and a couple of his dear friends who will help us with the Kenya part of our mission. We still have spaces for a few people to join us on the Kenya part of this trip if any of your are interested. ## I Am Sick, But Still Pushing On By God's Grace!

Many of you, our friends, know that for the past two years, I have had many health problems resulting in many trips to the doctors, sinus surgery in December of 2009, a terrible MRSA staph infection, plus major open heart surgery in March of 2010. During these past two years, JoAnne and I have tried so hard to keep going, even when my health has not been very good. We have made as many trips to Africa as we could, and when we have been home here in the states, we have traveled from church to church sharing the Gospel and presenting the work of GIMI as God has opened the doors. Because of pushing on with the work even when I have been sick, there have been skeptics and even some very caustic critics who have doubted my health issues. I have tried so hard to just simply disregard these self-righteous people and keep going on with this great ministry. But, since our last newsletter, JoAnne and I have received some bad news that we want to share with you so that you and your church family can really pray for my health and also this ministry!

Back in January of this year, I went to see a specialist at Baptist Hospital in Winston Salem, N.C., and this doctor had a CAT scan performed on my lungs. The report we received back was not good. They have determined that I have an incurable lung disease called "bronchiectasis". This is a disease that causes chronic lung infections which I have had for at least two years, and it ultimately causes the tissue of the lungs to deteriorate and it causes the bronchial tubes in the lungs to dilate and collapse resulting in very little air passing through them into my blood stream. Thus the proper amount of oxygen does not get into the blood and ultimately into the heart. The end result of this disease sometimes causes much pneumonia, sometimes bleeding in the lungs, and may result in heart failure. One doctor thinks that I may have contracted this disease from a fungus in Africa, while another one thinks it is related to a childhood of asthma. As I stated, it is considered to be incurable by human doctors, but right now, JoAnne and I are praying for a divine miracle of healing so that we can continue to carry on this ministry for several more years. We did get some good news this week, when we learned from another new doctor that my disease is not yet far advanced, and that the chronic infections are treatable so that I can have a pretty good quality of life. I have shared this news with you because we would ask that you join us in prayer for a divine miracle of healing, if this is God's will, so that we can continue on with the ministry of GIMI for sometime to come.

Many years ago when I started out preaching when I was just eighteen years old, I asked God to give me at least 50 years of ministry. Well, I haven't reached that just yet, so, I am still praying that God might answer this prayer. I have completed 45 years thus far, and I hope to have at least five or six more years to go before I have to get out of the picture. Would you please join JoAnne and myself, in praying that God would extend my life and give me the 50 plus years I asked him for way back in 1966? And also, would you please pray that God would help Brother Jeff Kautz to catch on quickly to the responsibilities of GIMI so that he can help pick up much of my responsibility for this great ministry? Jeff is doing a fine job, but there is so much to learn in the operation of GIMI. Pray that God will use him mightily as he assumes more and more responsibility for the work!

I also want to mention that due to the fact that I am not going to be able to make a trip to Africa every couple months, I will be spending more time doing radio broadcasts here at home. Please pray for our new radio ministry, and please consider helping us financially with this new avenue of sharing the Gospel because it will allow me to preach Jesus and share the work of GIMI. Pray that God will make this new effort very fruitful and productive. And of course, if we get on the air in your area, please tune in the broadcast. You can go to our website for a listing of stations and air times for the broadcasts, and they are listed in this newsletter.

## HAPPY EASTER! HE IS TRULY ALIVE!

This will be the last newsletter before Easter, and I want to wish all of you a very happy Easter! # GOOD NEWS from GHANA



Dear Faithful Partners in the Lord's Ministry,

Special Greetings to you all from Ghana. This is to bring you up to speed on how the ministry is going, and our expectations for 2011.

**ATOMIC HILLS BAPTIST CHURCH.** The church is still making progress, and the new Temple is looking incredibly beautiful. When every thing is done, it will become the talk of town. This new Temple can take about 600--- 800 people. Please continue to pray with us in our efforts to fill the new Temple with people who are prepared to serve God.

**SCHOOL MINISTRY.** The School Ministry is still growing. We have already taken on 3 more schools in the Volta Region this new year, 2011. This brings the total of the schools to 53. Our vision is to reach 100,000 students Nation wide by 2015, the time we have proposed to run the National Youth. This year's Youth Camp is coming on from August 7-13, 2011. Please start praying for funds to run the camp. We will need \$15,000.00 USD for this year's camp. And please if you are interested to come and help us run the camp, let me know by April 2011. In this way, we can prepare for your special visit.

**YOUTH CAMP VILLAGE.** The good news about the Village is that we have been able to convince the chief and elders in our village to add 5 more arches to the land for the Village Project. So now, we have a 20 acre plot of land for the project. However, the chief and the elders of our village are asking Cecilia and I to give them another \$2,000.00 USD in addition to the already \$3,000.00 USD we have spent on the land. I think this is reasonable for a 20 acre plot of land for \$5,000 USD. Can you please help us to pay for the land? Thank you.

**PRISON MINISTRY.** The prison ministry is also going on well. Brother Jeff is coming to spend 2 weeks with us to do ministry starting from March 7-21, 2011. I am sure that he will tell you more about how the ministries are going.

**NEW OFFICE.** I have started putting up 2 offices and a warehouse. The total cost is \$8000.00 USD. I have already spent \$1,100.00 USD. I now need \$6,900.00 USD to finish it. When finished this office and warehouse will serve both Ghana and Togo ministries, and possibly Benin too. Please help if you can, nothing is too small. Please pray that this year too will be another successful year. That many people will be won for the Lord Jesus Christ.

## A few lines from Liberia

I do thank God for what all He is doing with and through my life here in the various ministries I'm involved with here in Liberia. I'm also grateful to Gateway International Missions, Inc. for its continual prayer and financial supports toward the works in Liberia.

I thank God for the new church, Mehnpa Good News Baptist Church. The Lord continues to add to our attendance. New souls are being won and added to the church. The attendance on Sunday morning stands between fifty(50) and sixty(60) persons. We once again thank GIMI for the \$800.00 USD sent us to buy land for the church. We are presently working at getting the place. Pray for us as we plan to put a permanent church building on the land.

Praise be to God for the school program. We are now ministering to over three thousand (3000) students in over ten different schools. Over 150 souls are being won to the Lord monthly through the school program. Pray for us so that we can have more resources that will enable us to reach more schools. Presently, we have run out of the Bible literature that we usually give to the students. Pray for us to get at least 3,000 additional copies.

In order to have more effective workers, I have teamed up with some fundamental Baptist pastors to start a Bible school. I have been chosen to head the school. The school will start on March 1, 2011. The challenge in running a Bible school here in Liberia is very huge; therefore, I am asking you to pray for us to get the funds and materials we need to run the school effectively.

Once again I say, thanks so much for your continual prayer and financial support. Keep praying for me.

# Ukraine Update

Dear Beloved GIMI Prayer Partners and Supporters,

Most of you know that for several years, GIMI had a regular ministry in Ukraine, in addition to our ministry in Africa. During those years, God gloriously blessed our Ukraine ministry as we worked with Pastor Dima Bulakh and the dear people of Grace Evangelical Church in Kiev. In addition to working with Pastor Dima and his church, we also worked in the former KJB Prisons, schools, and orphanages. When the economic situation got so bad here in America, we decided to stop our regular ministry in Ukraine and concentrate just on Africa. When we stopped the work in Ukraine, I was so impressed with the Godly response that pastor Dima and his people had. They were certainly disappointed, but they did not get angry, but instead, just vowed to keep on serving Jesus. This was a great testimony for these precious people who have served Christ under the hardest of circumstances.

I am writing this extra note to share with you that due to the terrible winter weather this year in the Ukraine, and because of the political and economic situation in Ukraine, Pastor Dima and his people are really suffering right now. As a matter of fact, Pastor Dima and his family, along with many of their church members have not even had adequate food over the past couple of months. I learned of this situation through a friend of mine down in Florida this week, and my heart has truly been broken because of it. Pastor Dima and his people can't even meet in their church facilities on many of the cold Sundays because Russia has raised the price of their heating natural gas for the church to over \$4,000 per month. The church has had to lay off most of all of their staff, and if God's people don't help very soon, the church may have to close its doors. And, folks, that would truly be a tragedy. This church is one of the greatest churches in Eastern Europe, and it has been a lighthouse for many years. As a matter of fact, hundreds and hundreds have been saved through this church, and it would be so tragic to see the church have to close its doors; especially after the great First Baptist Church in Jacksonville, Florida, put almost a million dollars in this church years ago when it was first started.



So, I want to appeal to all of you to really consider helping Pastor Dima and his congregation. JoAnne and I are on Social Security, but this month we are sending at least \$500 to this church, and I hope that more of you will join us in helping to reach out with love and genuine compassion to this congregation that is suffering so much in a country that just a few years ago was behind the Iron Curtain. If you are able to help with this very desperate situation, please send your gifts to GIMI designated for Ukraine, and you also may go to our website and give through Pay Pal and via your credit cards. We really need to help right away because many of these dear people are getting inadequate food, and their church stands to close its doors if something is not done right away. Therefore, I ask you to please prayerfully consider helping with this situation right away. And, in doing so, may I ask you to not rob from your gifts to Africa to help the Ukraine because we still need to keep helping our people in Africa. If you have any questions about what you can do to help the Ukraine, please let us know here in our home office. Let me thank you in advance for what you are going to do for Jesus and our dear friends in Ukraine!

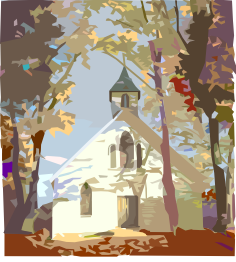

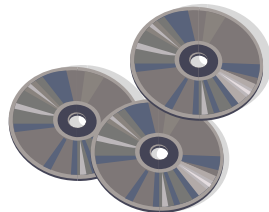
