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"Finally Home"

Many years ago, my dad was on a commercial airlines flight that landed in Nairobi, Kenya. Upon his return, he told me, *"Son, when that plane touched down and I looked out over the terrain, it was like I heard a louder than audible voice speaking to my heart, saying, 'Stan, you're **finally** home!'"* From early childhood and then with all the traveling, relocating, and across town, state, and country moving he did as a minister of the Gospel, Dad lived in a lot of residences, but deep within, he knew that home is not where your house is located, but home is where your heart loves.

The Lord had so burdened his heart that from that day forward, Africa would be his home and the United

States of America would just be a place he came back to for rest, renewal, and preparation for return. Over the last years of his life, I can tell you without a doubt that his heart longed to be home – on the beautiful continent of Africa.

Since before the Covid pandemic years, he was unable to return to Africa due to his debilitating health condition, but his longing and yearning never waned. To say that Dad was ALWAYS there "in spirit and in the Spirit" could never be considered an overstatement. He prayed, thought, planned, preached, worked, ate, talked, slept (not very much), bled, ached, hurt, and died for the place that had become his new home.

The only thing that would ever redirect his passion for that home would be another home, a new one, an eternal one in the heavens, one not made by human hands, a place he would often refer to as Sweet Beulah Land. Now, he's there, no doubt discussing with the song's writer, Mr. Squire Parsons, all the great things about their new home.

On Tuesday, September 23, at 12:38p.m. my dad, Dr. Stan Frye, got to take his final trip, no it wasn't to Rwanda, Uganda, Kenya, Ghana, Burundi, or another African country that he loved so much. Rather, he made his final flight to that heavenly country. As my mom so profoundly stated, *"He didn't go on an airplane, but he went on plain air."* As Luke 16 affirms, I believe my dad was carried by the angels of God into the very presence of the Lord, where he is now, **finally home**. Dad is now with his parents, family members, ministry friends, former church members, and many others. As our dear friend, Wade Spencer, sings, "There's a whole lot of people going home" and my dad was one of them.

At Dad's funeral, which you can view at <https://vimeo.com/1122216986?fl=tl&fe=ec>, a song that he selected years ago was played entitled, **Finally, Home**, reflect on these words...

*When alarmed by the fury of the restless sea,
Towering waves before you roll,
At the end of doubt and peril is eternity,
Though fear and conflict seize your soul
Just think of stepping on shore,
and finding it heaven
Of touching a hand, and finding it God's
Of breathing new air, and finding it celestial

A Powerful Radio Testimony Received Just Days Prior To Dr. Frye's Passing

My name is Annet, and I give glory to the Lord Jesus Christ for saving me. I got saved from Dunamis radio.

I grew up in a family deeply rooted in witchcraft. From a young age, I was taught rituals and charms, and my life was surrounded by darkness.

I remember when I was still in school, my grandmother gave me a small piece of wood, telling me to always carry it to class so that I would be clever and excel in my studies. I trusted in that charm, but it never worked. Instead of being successful, I ended up a failure in my village. People looked down on me, and I felt worthless and hopeless.

As I grew older, I sank deeper into witchcraft practices. The community feared me, and I was even being prepared to inherit the powers of a well-known witch doctor. But inside my heart, there was only emptiness. I often felt I had reached a point of no return, trapped in darkness with no way out. My nights were full of torment, and I thought my life was finished.

Then, by the mercy of God, I tuned in to Dunamis Radio. I heard you preaching the Gospel, and the words struck my heart. For the first time, I realized that Jesus loved me and that He could forgive even the worst sinner. That day, I gave my life to Christ, and I felt chains breaking from my life.

Later, I contacted sister Esther at Dunamis Radio and she gave me a Bible, and everything changed. The Word of God has now become my light and my teacher. Unlike the piece of wood that failed me, the Bible is giving me true wisdom, guidance, and hope.

Today, I am no longer a failure, or a woman trapped in darkness. I am a new creation in Christ Jesus. God has not only saved me, but He has also used me to lead my entire family away from witchcraft into the light of Christ. We now pray together, read the Word together, and serve the Lord together. Pastor they also need the bibles and teaching books

I boldly testify that if Jesus could lift me from the pit of failure and witchcraft, then there is no one beyond His saving power. Truly, Jesus is the only answer.



"Holy Cow!"

This often-expressed phrase is an exclamation of surprise used mostly in the United States, Canada, Australia, and England. It dates to 1905 when it appeared in a tongue-in-cheek letter to the editor of the Minneapolis Journal. A lover of cows was protesting against an oath having to do with the vain use of the name of the milk producing beast. Some believe it was used to avoid using obscene or indecent language. I'd like to introduce or recommend a new meaning to the two words, "holy cow".

For many years, since learning that prisoners in many African countries do not receive any meat in their annual diet, GIMI has been purchasing cows at Christmas to supply beef for hundreds of people. Of course, this gift comes with the understanding that we can share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and celebrate His birth with worship, praise, and preaching, followed by giving an invitation for prisoners, officers, staff, others to trust the miraculous born Jesus as their Savior. Thus, you might say, these cows have been used for a sacred purpose or... become holy cows.

Now before you send me an email, I do understand that animals in and of themselves are not inherently sacred or profane according to **I Timothy 4:3b-5...**

meats, which God hath created to be received with thanksgiving of them which believe and know the truth. ⁴For every creature of God is good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving: ⁵For it is sanctified by the word of God and prayer.

This was a very important matter to Dr. Frye! Would you consider making a special gift to GIMI, perhaps in honor or memory of him and his love for this blessed Christmas time project. Each cow purchased cost approximately \$300, which is very little in comparison to the joy it brings those who partake of it, the nourishment it gives, and the opportunity to share the invaluable message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

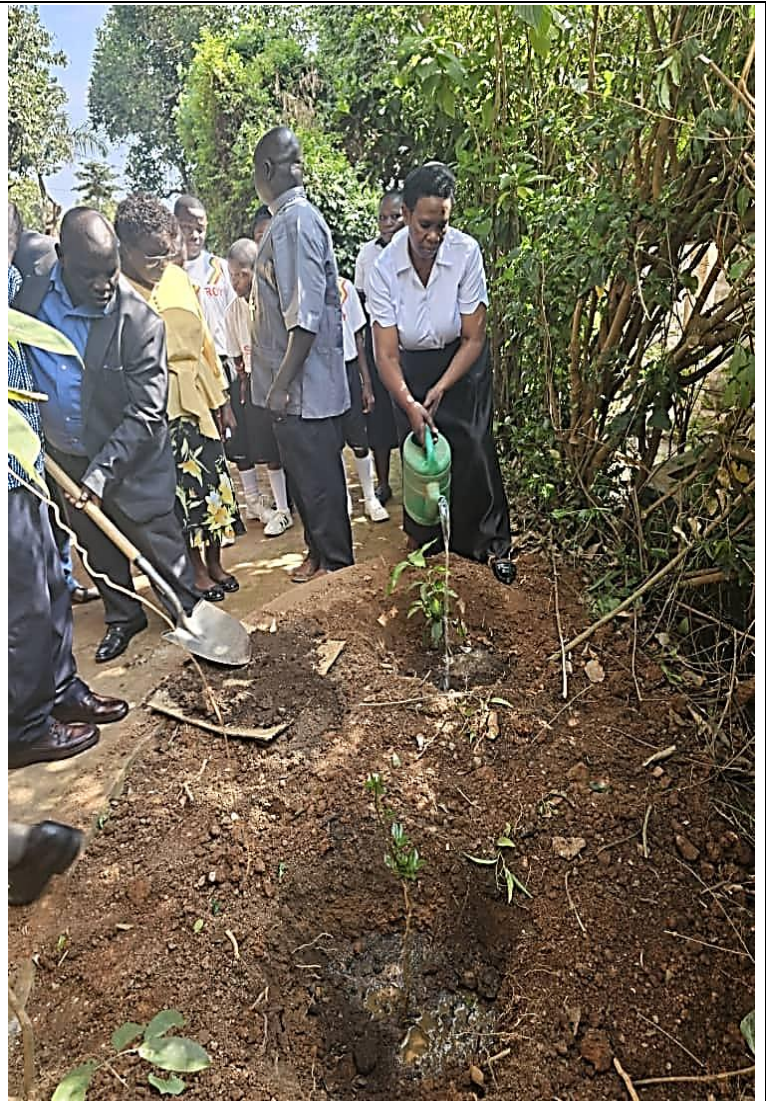

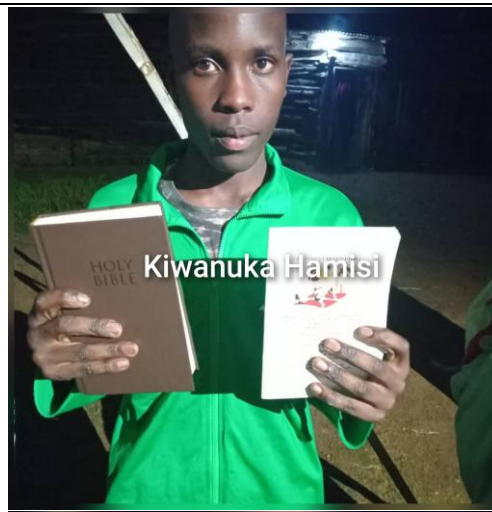

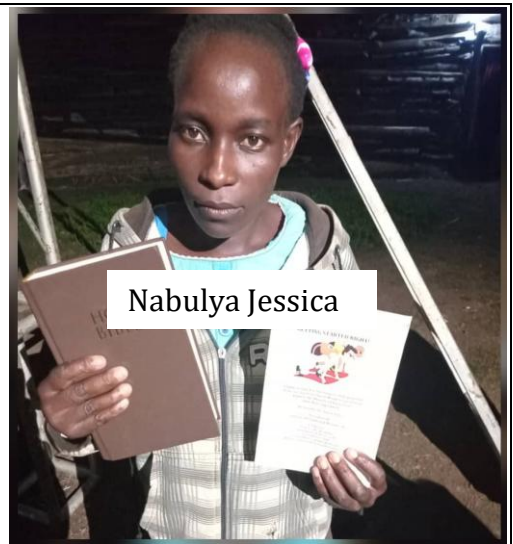

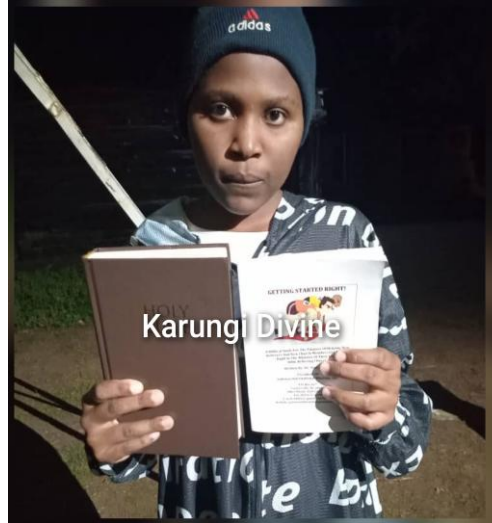

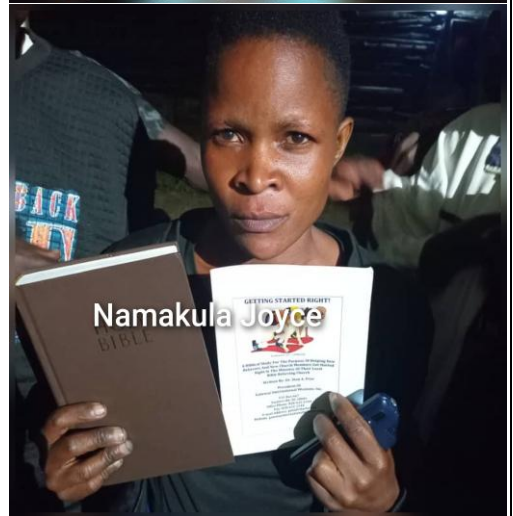

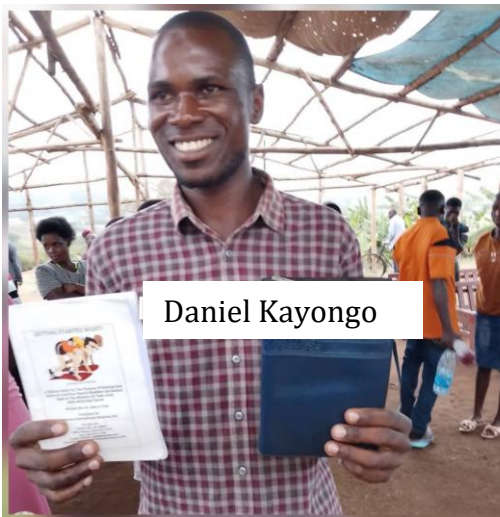

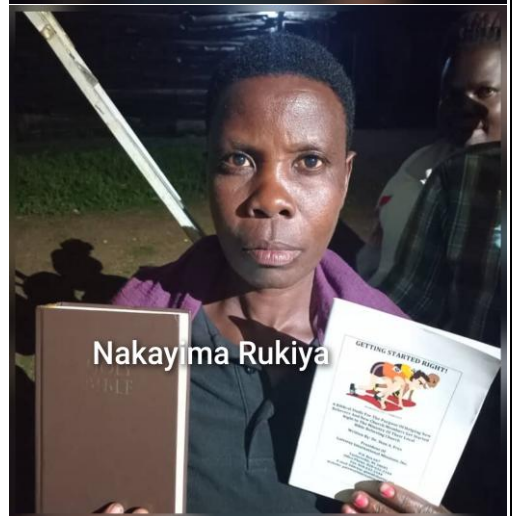

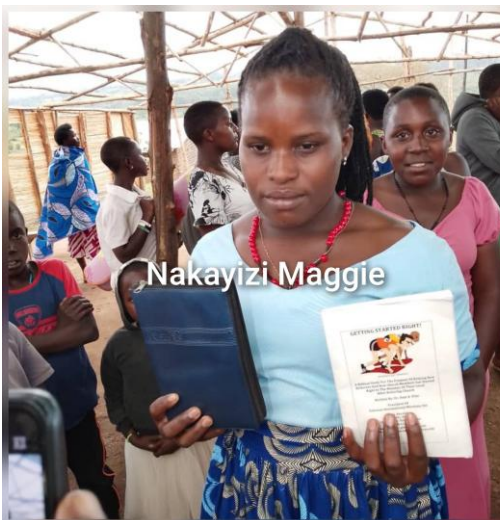

I. Notice the Requirements of Thanksgiving. vs. 1-2

A. There should be a delightful shout. v.1

1. God desires it. v. 1a
2. God demands it. v.1b

B. There should be a dedicated service. v.2a

1. This should be a voluntary service.
2. This should be a victorious service.

C. There should be a directed song v.2b

1. This should be a song of worship.
2. This should be a song of witness.

II. Notice the reasons for Thanksgiving

A. We should be thankful because He is Sovereign. v.3a

1. He is our Master
2. He is our Maker

B. We should be thankful because He is our Savior. v.3b

1. He is our Savior presently.
2. He is our Savior personally.

C. We should be thankful because He is our Shepherd. v.3c

1. Because of this, we have a wonderful relationship.
2. Because of this, we have wonderful refreshment.

III. Notice the responsibility for Thanksgiving

A. This responsibility demands personal actions. v.4a

1. We are to enter.
2. We are to exalt.

B. This responsibility demands personal adoration. v.4b

1. In our adoration, we recognize Him.
2. In our adoration, we reverence Him.

C. This responsibility demands personal acknowledgements. v.5

1. We need to acknowledge His character. v. 5a
2. We need to acknowledge His compassion. v. 5b
3. We need to acknowledge His commitment. v. 5c
